When children and youth are unable to remain safely at home and enter into kinship/foster care, the ultimate goal is for safe permanency to be achieved through reunification. Research shows that children do best when raised in their own families, whenever possible. To achieve safe reunification of children with their families, a strong partnership between birth parents, foster parents, the child welfare system, courts and other community partners is critical.

We celebrate reunification month by acknowledging the hard work of parents who achieve reunification as well as the team of individuals that help make reunification possible. Thank you for your role in supporting the reunification of children and youth with their families this year.

June is Pride Month!



June is recognized as Pride Month, a time to celebrate LGBTQ+ identities and cultures and support LGBTQ+ rights.

According to the Administration for Crimule 1 & Families, youth who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and/or questioning (LGBTQ+) are "3.8 times more likely to experience childhood sexual abuse, 1.2 times more likely to be physically abused by a caregiver, and nearly 2.5 times more likely to enter foster care than their heterosexual peers

Through support, education, and community outreach the risk of abuse to this diverse population of youth can be lowered. Organizations such as the Washington County gay straight Alliance facilitates and provides resources for LGBTQ+ youth. In addition, they facilitate a monthly social gathering for

- Congress passed a new law called "Supporting Foster Youth and Families Through the Pandemic Act", which provides extended support for young people who left, or might be leaving, the child welfare system during the pandemic. This law allows us to provide youth with aftercare services such as room and board assistance, as well as other services like Housing, Education, Employment, and Life Skills.
