








Provider Spotlight Information provided by Mary Kay Bonn

In 1966, the Pennsylvania State Legislature passed the Mental Health/Mental Retardation Act which had as its major purpose "to make it possible for every person with a mental disability to receive the kind of treatment he needs, when and where he needs it." Catchment areas were set up statewide and each area was headed by a Base Service Unit (BSU). The BSU was to see that the mandated services were offered to the public. As a result, a community meeting was held in July of 1968 and a plan was endorsed to create Chartiers Community Mental Health and Retardation Center. In May 1969, the first official meeting of the Chartiers MH/MR Center was held, and a permanent Board of Directors was elected. A series of task forces and committees were created that included community constituents whose purpose was to identify the services that would best benefit and meet the needs of the community's citizens.


Now, in our 54th year of service to the community, Chartiers Center continues to make it possible for every person to receive the kind of treatment he or she needs, when and where he or she needs it. The staff and leadership of Chartiers Center are committed to providing compassionate support to those in need who face behavioral health, co-occurring disorders, or IDD challenges as they transform their lives.

Chartiers Center is a private, non-profit corporation funded by the state, county, third-party insurances, and private funds. Services have grown to include a wide range of programs and service locations to assist behavioral health consumers and families, and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. To best meet the consumer's needs, the focus is on the integration of physical health and mental wellness.









The clinic, located at 90 West Chestnut Street, East Wing Entrance, is now open for referrals by calling our Intake Specialist at 412 221-3302 ext.123. If you prefer you can email <u>Intake@chartierscenter.org</u> with your questions. Walk-ins are welcome, during which time you can schedule an initial appointment.


Dear Friends:

Private Industry Council-DADS MATTER

The DADS MATTER Program builds upon effective practices in fatherhood initiatives identified in research and strategies that were implemented in the Private Industry Council's prior successful DADS MATTER Program, with its initial inception in Fayette County, PA in 2007.

The DADS MATTER Program is a voluntary program that is federally-funded by the United States Department of Health and Human Services and Administration for Children and Families. It is a five-year grant (September 30, 2020-September 29, 2025) that encourages fathers/father figures to be the BEST that they can be by offering 4-6 week group sessions (virtual or in-person) that provide an opportunity for men to network and share common parenting /family experiences.

The DADS MATTER Program provides voluntary services for community fathers/father figures who reside in Beaver, Fayette, Washington, and Westmoreland Counties. You must be 18 years or older and caring for at least 1 child age 24 or younger. Father figures can include adoptive/foster fathers, grandfathers in a caregiving role, men residing and/or co-parenting with a partner who has children, older sibling or relative, or expectant fathers. There are no income guidelines.

In addition, workforce and education training options (virtual and/or in-person) are available that include forklift, scissor lift, financial wellness, economic stability, and behavior/learning support.
