

#### Seed to Supper 2025




Free gardening classes beginning April 3 Taught by Penn State Master Gardeners Enjoy your own home-grown produce!!!


### **Employee Spotlights**


#### Halle Stolze, Aging Services Care Manager

## Private Industry Council – DADS Matter

The DADS MATTER Program builds upon effective practices in fatherhood initiatives identified in research and strategies that were implemented in the Private Industry Council's prior successful DADS MATTER Program, with its initial inception in Fayette County, PA in 2007.

The DADS MATTER Program is a voluntary program that is federally funded by the United States Department of Health and Human Services and Administration for Children and Families. It is a five-year grant (September 30, 2020-September 29, 2025) that encourages fathers/father figures to be the BEST that they can be by offering 4–6-week group sessions (virtual or inperson) that provide an opportunity for men to network and share common parenting/family experiences.

The DADS MATTER Program provides voluntary services for community fathers/father figures who reside in Beaver, Fayette, Washington, and Westmoreland Counties. You must be 18 years or older and caring for at least 1 child aged 24 or younger. Father figures can include adoptive/foster fathers, grandfathers in a caregiving role, men residing and/or co-parenting with a partner who has children, older sibling or relative, or expectant fathers. There are no income guidelines.

In addition, workforce and education training options (virtual and/or in-person) are available that include forklift, scissor lift, financial wellness, economic stability, and behavior/learning support.
